

Each year, schools in the Peru Central School District provide information to parents about in-house and community based programs associated with:

- non-violent crisis intervention efforts and initiatives;
- peer mediation groups;
- reporting procedures for student bullying;
- reporting procedures for school violence and
- school-community partnerships to promote increased school safety and security.

Peru Intermediate shares two counselors with Peru Primary. The counselors provide individual and group counseling, as well as in-class programs that highlight conflict resolution and positive self-discipline choices. Using the “Getting Along Program,” counselors implement lessons that are designed to address bullying, conflict management and problem solving.

Additionally, at Peru Intermediate, we partner with the New York State Police and the Clinton County Sheriff Departments to present programs on personal safety. Students also participate in the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program.

Our Peru Intermediate Building Level Team sponsors a school-wide incentive program that recognizes “Citizen of the Month.” Each “Citizen of the Month” displays the character traits of a good citizen.

Each September, the Principal conducts a town hall meeting to introduce rules, behavior expectations, and the importance of respect at each grade level.

Our district has a District-Wide Safety Plan that delineates information on crisis and safety with clear, concise expectations and protocols for emergency and safety response.
