Several safety concerns have been reported to the main office related to student safety in the morning. I want to send a friendly reminder to parents that beginning April 18th, 2017, please be sure


to walk your K-2 students into the building and sign them in at the K-2 office when bringing your child to school. This will help to ensure the safety of all our students being brought to school in the mornings.

STEM stands for Science.

Technology, Engineering and Math.

They use the building toys in each class to make tall towers, vehicles, houses or even communities! The children have started learning more about animals by doing research online at Pebble Go in the Computer Lab. Many of the students have already completed animal reports! The children have been learning about what having a positive mindset means.

have also been learning new math and reading skills. They are learning strategies to help them add and subtract double digit numbers.

From the Math/Reading Interventionist

Happy Spring! Here are some Spring Math Tips to help you work on math with your child:

S tudy your math facts often – flash cards can make it like a game! The more your child has their math facts memorized, the easier and quicker they will be able to work on math topics.

P rove your answers! Have students realize that you're not just solving a number sentence - you are trying to provide evidence for your answer. That is why it is always best to show your work instead of solving in your head.

R ead directions 2 times CAREFULLY – often children make mistakes because they don't read the directions and problem carefully.

I dentify areas where you, as an adult, use math. Sometimes children have difficulty with math because they feel like they will not use it in the real world. Mention how you use math to cook, measure laundry soap, sew, or do household construction projects. Having real world context helps! Have them help you with these chores that incorporate math.

N ote areas of success – don't focus on their failures. Math is a subject that many people struggle with and children often get the stuck mind set that they're just not good in math. By celebrating their success and how hard they are working, this is less likely to happen. They may not be great at math YET, but they will be!

G eometry is math too! When the opportunity arises, have your child tell you the shapes of objects, talk about the number of sides it has, how many corners, is it three dimensional or two dimensional? Having this background knowledge will strengthen your child's geometry skills.
