Dear Peru Central School District Community,

Although there have been no confirmed cases of Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in the Peru community, we have been closely monitoring the situation in New York State and the United States. School Officials are working closely with CEWW BOCES, Clinton County Health Department and Clinton County Emergency Services in order to be prepared.
